

#### Loops & Instrumentation IIII

- Four basic instrumental roles in Hip-Hop:
  - Piano/Chords
  - Beat/Drums
  - Bass/808
  - Hook/Melody

#### Form: Hip-Hop "ABAB..."

- Form refers to the layout or overall roadmap/structure of a song. Think "verse", "chorus", "bridge", etc.
- In Hip-Hop, the focus heavily relies on the lyrics, so the instrumental or the music behind the rapper/MC is usually pretty repetitive and easily structured in a repeating "binary form" (AB/verse, chorus). We call this Hip-Hop Form or ABABAB...

# Take a closer look at "N.Y. State of Mind" by Nas

The song simply alternates between several verses and the chorus:



 Loops are lined up (starting and ending at the same point)






• Loops/Tracks are all in the same key (check by hovering over the loop. Make sure you have loops that are the capital letter alone, meaning "Major" or all loops with the little "m", meaning "minor").






 Your song starts at the beginning of the region area (no space in the beginning of the track).
